#### Dear Sir or Madam

The Hills Swimming and Life Saving Club will be holding a carnival at Waves Fitness and Aquatic Centre, 44 Mileham Ave, Baulkham Hills on Saturday February 03, 2018 commencing at 3:00pm.

Traditionally, we hold a carnival on this weekend for our local primary school children. Swimmers, swim individually, win ribbons and earn points for their school. Following the completion of the carnival 2 perpetual trophies are awarded - a boy's trophy and a girl's trophy. These trophies are awarded to the schools with the highest point score.

Jasper Road Public School currently holds both the boy's and the girl's trophy.

The program for our February 2018 carnival, has a 'break time' for each event is in place, restricting entry for faster swimmers. This enables any child that can swim 50 metres to participate. It is an invaluable opportunity for children that do not swim competitively on a regular basis to gain some experience swimming under race conditions prior to their school & zone swimming carnivals. Children do not need to be a registered member of a swimming club, Swimming NSW or Swimming Australia to compete.

To enter the carnival, swimmers will be required to pre-register. A copy of the program along with an entry form are attached to this letter. Alternatively, this information can be accessed on our club's website: www.thehills.swimming.org.au.

Participants and spectators will be required to pay regular pool entry into Waves Fitness and Aquatic Centre. We will be able to provide free entry for 1 teacher/parent as a team manager per school. To be eligible for this, you will need to RSVP and advise who will be attending.

It would be appreciated if you could contact us to advise if your school proposes participating in the carnival. Please contact myself if you have any questions. We look forward to your attendance and participation.

#### WINTER sport registrations for 2018 trials will open on MONDAY, 13th November. Registrations for Winter sports will close on FRIDAY 2ND FEBRUARY 2018. NO LATE REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Any Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2018 are invited to register to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials which will be held during Term Four in 2017 (Summer sports—Registrations have closed) and Term One in 2018 (Winter sports). In some sports students in Year 4 MAY nominate. SUMMER SPORT REGISTRATION HAS CLOSED.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is **strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in Years 5 & 6 in 2018 be invited to attend**.

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports: \*AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G), & Touch(B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website <u>www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au</u>

This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2018 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. Parents may complete this form to attend a selection trial. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST** be approved by the child's school. In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. All fields and especially "Representative Experience" MUST be completed.

This online form is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST for the 2018 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport and when completed, click SUBMIT.

Please note that your online registration is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY and MUST be approved by your child's school. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience".

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

\$8.00 trialling fee is payable on the day for after school trials & \$10.00 trialling fee is payable on the day for half day and full day trials. ration at the trials once your child has been approved to at and the Parramatta D

Please note that the full day trials will be for boys cricket, boys soccer, boys rugby league & boys rugby union. Due to the popularity of boys cricket, boys soccer and girls netball a maximum of 2 children only are eligible to trial from each school. Selection of the 2 boys and girls will be made jointly by the school sport coordinator and principal.

Half day trial for tennis and netball... all other trials will be held after school beginning at 4pm.

## MACKILLOP TRIAL

It should be noted that the main purpose of the Mackillop trial is to select a team to compete at the NSW PSSA Championships. The Inter-Diocesan MacKillop Trial is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to facilitate the selection procedure.

### NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Children who are successful at being selected in the Mackillop team will compete at the N.S.W. P.S.S.A. Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Children selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships a State team will be selected to participate at the School Sport Australia Inter State Exchange for some sports.

## SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA

To be considered for selction in the NSWPSSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & Under championships: Students mus be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSWPSSA State selection.

Please note the following information:

- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements and must remain to supervise their child at the trial at all times.
- Children need to generally be of representative standard.
- Attendance at training days, where applicable is compulsory.
- The selector's decisions are final.
- Parents will need to make their own travel arrangements for children representing Parramatta at Inter-Diocesan MacKillop trials. This
  may mean travel to Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra, Wagga or Forbes.
- Please be aware that the teacher conducting the trial and accompanying the team to the venue is a "Team Manager" ~ not a coach.

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will <u>not</u> need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.
