Dear Parents

Please be aware OLOR 2018 Medication Forms for those children who have medication stored or administered at school due to anaphylaxis, allergies or asthma were distributed last week.

It is essential that these forms and action plans are updated annually by your child's doctor so that our records are accurate and reflect the needs of each individual child.

Please note, it is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their child's medication remains current, ie. not expired.

Religious Education



Next Wednesday, 14th February, marks the first day of Lent. **We invite all parents and friends of OLOR to join us for our Ash Wednesday Mass at Our Lady of the Rosary, Kellyville Parish Church at 9:15am.**

The ashes for Ash Wednesday are prepared by burning palms from the previous Palm Sunday. The ashes symbolise the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and continues for forty days. Lent's liturgical colour, violet, symbolises awareness of sin and readiness for conversion. Lent is a season of penance, prayer, reflection and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday through which we attain redemption.

News from Sr. Antoinette



Dear Parents,

Welcome to 2018. I look forward to working with your children and yourselves in 2018. For the new parents at OLOR I would like to share with you some of the work I do. My main focus is Pastoral Care and I assist the classes with Christian Meditation and other well being activities. I am also available if a parent needs a listening ear. I am available on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

PBS4L: Our main focus for the next two weeks will be "Active Listening". The children are being encouraged to really take time to listen in class and in the playground and to be able to process what is being said. Please be active listeners with your children and encourage them to do likewise.

I came across this excellent article this week which I would like to share with you:

A recent study has discovered that mums and dads who used more so-called challenging parent behaviour (CPB) had kids whose anxiety levels were significantly less than others.

The study by researchers from Sydney's Macquarie University and University of Amsterdam focused on parenting behaviour that may actually protect children from becoming anxious.

One of the study's co-authors, Rebecca Lazarus, says behaviours that can have a protective effect on kids include giving them a fright, teasing, rough-and-tumble play, as well as encouraging them to be assertive and take risks. "The idea behind CPB is it gives children exposure to safe risk, so things that might be a bit anxiety provoking but lets them know that it's actually ok," Ms Lazarus said. "It's this repeated exposure to things that might feel unsafe that reduces their anxiety and they learn they can cope by themselves."

Seven per cent of Aussie kids aged between four and 17 are estimated to have anxiety. There are many simple everyday ways parents can display CPB to help their kids. It could be things like encouraging the child if they are cautious about approaching something, so like a dog in a park. They might be frightened of dogs, but you can encourage them by showing them how you approach a dog and let it sniff your hand. It also includes competitions like running races or playing games with kids. It's all safe and gentle but it lets kids have that experience at losing and what that feels like.

Certainly more studies are needed into CPB as a possible treatment for anxiety in children.

An Advent Moment

Project-Based Learning at OLOR Kellyville

"If we teach today's students as we taught yesterday's, we rob them of tomorrow."

— John Dewey

There's no arguing that core subjects including English, Mathematics, Science and HSIE are important in the intellectual development of young learners. Where there's room for debate is the method which can best help students connect these subjects to one another and see the relevance of such knowledge sets and skills in 'the real world.'

Enter Project-Based Learning (PBL), a teaching and learning pedagogy that focuses on the concept of 'learning by doing', engages students' hearts and minds, and provides a real-world relevance for learning.

Learning by doing is not a new concept. In fact, Socrates' model of learning involved questioning, inquiry, and critical thinking. That said, the traditional view of education in the 20th century centered around students being passive receivers of knowledge with teachers simply serving as a vehicle to deliver a static body of facts. It wasn't until John Dewey, an American educational theorist and philosopher, argued for engaging experiences that helped students become inspired to be lifelong learners in a changing world.

Since PBL uses examples of problems that people face in their everyday professional and personal life, students learn the hard and soft skills needed for navigating such challenges. **Creativity, collaboration, communication**, and other soft skills are key outcomes for students. These are more than just buzzwords, they're essential skills that employers are looking for across all fields,. Because students' projects are based on collaborative group work, students engage in the daily practice of cooperation and problem solving and participate in regular reflection sessions where groups think about what they've done well, and their next steps in learning.

We look forward to sharing regular updates of our PBL at OLOR Kellyville throughout the year and to showcase our 21st Century Skills at our **PBL Open Day** which will be held in Term 3 of 2018.

CHANGES TO STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS: COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 years attend school. Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Extended Leave from attendance for student absence and travel

- **1-4 days absence:** Parents **must** notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date.
- **5 or more days absence:** Parents must complete and submit the [*Application for Extended Leave*](#) form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application). If approved the Principal issues a [*Certificate of Extended Leave*](#). If the Principal declines this application (i.e it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

HAVING ISSUES WITH THE Skoolbag app

If you find you are not receiving messages or have lost your alert ping, sometimes it is just a matter of removing and re-installing the app.

System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.



USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

1. Open Skoolbag app
2. Click on eForms
3. Select Absentee Form
4. Complete all fields
5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm is not to be used for extended Family leave.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY ALL PARENT VOLUNTEERS INCLUDING THOSE WHO ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the ‘Volunteer Form’ and the ‘Module’ have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

‘Building Child Safe Communities’ is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. **It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form** that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- **A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.**

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.

4. Wait for confirmation email
5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.
