#### News from Sr. Antoinette

Dear Parents,

I hope the mid year break is an enjoyable time for you and your family to experience together. I found this wonderful article on "What is Respect "which I am sharing with you this week:

"Respect means different things to different people. For some, respect is reserved for authority: it's how we show honor to those in charge. For others, respect is more about tolerance and a basic regard for others.

Here are six thoughtful perspectives on what it means to be respectful.

1. "The truest form of love is how you behave toward someone, not how you feel about them." —Steve Hall

If love is defined by respect, then we show true respect through our actions rather than our feelings or intentions.

2. "I speak to everyone in the same way, whether he is the garbage man or the president of the university." —Albert Einstein

Respect amounts to simple decency and courtesy, and that is something we all deserve regardless of rank.

- 3. "Respect yourself and others will respect you." —Confucius
- Having respect for ourselves indicates to others how we wish to be treated.
- 4. "I'm not concerned with your liking or disliking me... All I ask is that you respect me as a human being." —Jackie Robinson

We cannot pick and choose who we respect based on personal bias or likeability. True respect goes beyond popularity and superficial traits.

- 5. "Respect is a two-way street, if you want to get it, you've got to give it." -R.G. Risch Respect is a mutual exchange between two individuals. When one person stops giving, the dynamic is no longer balanced.
- 6. "If you have some respect for people as they are, you can be more effective in helping them to become better than they are." -John W. Gardner

Respect is acknowledging a person's inherent worth and dignity. When we do that, they'll feel encouraged to fulfill their potential.

No matter how you view it, respect comes down to how we treat other individuals. When we respect someone we listen to them, take them seriously, and give them space to express themselves. Think of the people in your life. Are you showing them the basic respect they deserve? "

# SCHOOL ZONE OFFENCES WHAT ARE YOU RISKING?\*



Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremely vulnerable. They need YOU to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones.



# No Parking

No waiting. You have 2 minutes to drop-off or pick-up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

\$183 2 DEMERIT



# No Stopping

You must not stop on a length of road with a No

+ 2 DEMERIT POINTS Stopping sign. The first 10m from an intersection is a no stopping zone. Yellow kerb lines are also No Stopping zones.



# **Bus Zone**

Only a public bus can stop in a bus zone.

ENALTIES \$330 2 DEMERIT POINTS

# Mobile Phones

Extra fines apply for using mobile phones in a school zone.

ENALTIES \$439 4 DEMERIT **POINTS** 

May be subject to Double Demerits

# Speeding Offences



40km/h is the limit. Children are vulnerable, so slow down in school zones.

ENALTIES \$ 192 **POINTS** 

May be subject to Double Demerits

# Pedestrian Crossings

1. In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle can stop on a pedestrian crossing.

2. Do not let your child in or out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing as this is a No Stopping zone.

# **Driveways &** Footpaths

ENALTIES \$330 2 DEMERIT POINTS

Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath.

# U turns

Illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across double white lines.

330 3 DEMERIT POINTS

# **Double Parking**

Double parking is illegal and is very dangerous in a school zone.

# **OLOR IS NUT FREE**

We have an increasing number of children in our school who suffer from an anaphylaxis reaction to certain foods etc. but in particular, nuts.

To assist in our duty of care for these children, direct nut products or products that list nuts as an actual ingredient, eg. peanut butter and nutella, are not permitted at Our Lady of the Rosary School. Please also keep this vigilance when sending in birthday cakes, cupcakes and other confectionary for whatever purpose. Additionally, we will continue to ask that children not to share their food.

### CHANGES TO STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS: COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 years attend school. Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

### Requirements for Extended Leave from attendance for student absence and travel

- 1-4 days absence: Parents **must** notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date.
- 5 or more days absence: Parents must complete and submit the <u>Application for Extended Leave</u> form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application). If approved the Principal issues a <u>Certificate of Extended Leave</u>. If the Principal declines this application (i.e it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.



# Skoolbag USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

- Open Skoolbag app 1.
- Click on eForms 2.
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- 4. Complete all fields
- In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen 5.
- Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

#### This eForm is not to be used for extended Family leave.

# PARENT VOLUNTEERS WITHIN THE DIOCESE OF PARRAMATTA

New directive from the Diocesan Office 25th May 2016

#### BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behavior whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centers. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

**Volunteers** – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' by accessing the **form** via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage <a href="www.parra.catholic.edu.au">www.parra.catholic.edu.au</a>, then click on

the 'Volunteers and Contractors-Click here' image (halfway down page on the right hand side). This image will take you to the Building Safe Communities page.

Click on the green Volunteer tab (left hand side)

Click on Step 1—Volunteer Form and follow the steps

#### You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.



<u>www.parra.catholic.edu.au</u>, then click on the 'Volunteers and Contractors-Click here' image (halfway down page on the right hand side). This image will take you to the Building Safe Communities page.

Click on the green Volunteer tab (left hand side)

Click on Step 2—Complete the Online Training Module

Once you complete this online module the school will receive notification that it has been completed and you will be cleared to volunteer.

# Therefore in brief:

- 1. To complete form go to: www.parra.catholic.edu.au and follow Step 1 above
- 2. Wait for confirmation email
- 3. On receipt of the confirmation email follow Step 2 above to complete Child Protection Online Module
- 4. Wait for confirmation email
- 5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.
